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FOUNDATION FINALIZES STRATEGIC PLAN AIMED AT REDUCING VIBRIO VULNIFICUS RELATED ILLNESSES

Tampa, Florida – The Gulf & South Atlantic Fisheries Foundation, Inc. has finalized a Strategic Plan aimed at reducing the number of *Vibrio vulnificus* related illnesses linked to raw oyster consumption. The strategies incorporated in the Plan were finalized during the most recent meeting of an Advisory Group comprised of individuals from the Gulf of Mexico oyster industry, state health and marketing agencies, and various NGO's.

"This Strategic Plan and the associated activities will greatly enhance the awareness of *Vibrio vulnificus* within both the medical/health community and at-risk consumer groups," Foundation Board Member Mike Voisin said today. The strategies included in the <u>Strategic Plan</u> are:

- Contract with and train educational specialists to educate medical/health professionals and the at-risk consumer;
- Expand the number of presentations and booth exhibitions at professional conferences to educate medical/health professionals;
- Conduct/fund a direct mail campaign to educate medical/health professionals;
- Utilize radio and television commercials to broadcast and advertise educational messages to the at-risk consumer;
- Develop new educational materials and expand distribution channels to increase awareness among the medical/health community and at-risk consumer group;
- Place educational advertisements, editorials and articles in selective medical trade journals and magazines to educate medical/health professionals and the at-risk consumer;
- Develop partnerships with major pharmaceutical companies to assist in educational efforts;
- Create a dedicated Vibrio vulnificus website to assist in the education of the at-risk consumer;

- Develop and/or expand alliances with various interest groups (i.e., National/State Liver Foundations, National/State Diabetes Associations, State Medical Associations, etc.) to assist with educational efforts; and
- Develop a Vibrio vulnificus identifier logo.

"We have started to implement many of the strategies in the plan that will reinforce other educational campaigns already in place. The Gulf of Mexico oyster community is extremely energized about the strategies included in this plan, as they have continuously strived to educate the at-risk consumer about the threat of *Vibrio vulnificus*", Ms. Jamison, Foundation Executive Director, said.
